Medicare Advantage Open Enrollment Period

The Medicare Advantage Open Enrollment Period starts January 1 and ends March 31 every year. During this period, you can switch Medicare Advantage plans or leave a Medicare Advantage plan and return to Original Medicare.

Whether you recently enrolled or have had your Medicare Advantage plan for years, you can take this opportunity to confirm - or change - your plan choice. Think about your experiences using your plan and review your plan benefits. How does your plan stack up in the following areas?

- Your doctor and other providers are in the plan network.
- Your prescription drugs are on the plan formulary.
- You are comfortable with your costs, including premiums, deductibles, copays, and coinsurance.
- You have the additional coverage that you want for things like dental, vision, and hearing care.

If you decide to make a change, you have from January 1 - March 31 to do it. You can explore other plan options. Your new plan benefits will be in effect for the rest of the year the month after the changes were made!

WHAT'S NEW WITH MEDICARE IN 2024

- Part A premium has decreased to \$505 a month for those who do no not quality for a free premium
- Part B premium is increasing from \$164.90 to \$174.70
- Under the new drug law, Medicare Part D plan members whose prescription costs are so high that they enter the catastrophic phase of coverage will not have any more out-of-pocket costs for the rest of the year once they and their plan have spent \$8,000 on their medications
- New drug law in affect to expand eligibility for Extra Help—income threshold increased to 150 percent of the federal poverty level (\$21,870 per individual)
- Beginning Jan. 1, licensed marriage and family therapists as well as <u>mental health</u> counselors, will be able to enroll in the Medicare program so they can be paid for treating Medicare enrollees, expanding eligibility for these important services



HAPPENINGS

AHN MAP completed yet another successful Open Enrollment! We are happy to announce that our MAP counselors assisted over 1560 Medicare beneficiaries in 2023. MAP also traveled to each of our 13 counties at least once a month, resulting in over 100 enrollment events and 18 presentations. MAP also scheduled regular appointments at the Carson City Senior Center and walkins at Washoe Senior Center weekly. The AHN offices in Reno

and Elko also assisted 68 walkins along with scheduled appointments.

AHN MAP is excited for the upcoming year. AHN MAP is focused on creating new partnerships within the community and expanding our bi-monthly MAP meetings to organizations in the community that provide resources to beneficiaries. Our vision for 2024 is to reconstruct our bi-monthly meetings to not only provide updated Medicare infor-

mation, but also community updates and resources that counselors can use to further assist beneficiaries. MAP is contacting different organizations to provide Medicare 101 presentations for their soon-to-be retirees, such as school districts, postal offices etc. AHN MAP is looking forward to 2024! We're hoping it's our best year yet!

FRAUD IN THE NEWS

Genetic testing is an interesting concept. Just one swab, and you can learn about you and your family's history in a few short weeks. Unfortunately, this technology has brought its fair share of bad actors looking to capitalize.

Recently, a woman in Florida was sentenced to 20 years in prison for illegally signing thousands of orders for medical equipment, including genetic tests. Elizabeth Hernandez played a part in a scam involving telemarketing companies that convinced Medicare patients that they needed these products, including tests that would inform beneficiaries if they had predispositions to cancer or other serious diseases.

The innate curiosity (or fear) of the unknown is a natural part of human life. We often question our own mortality, and these fraudsters are praying on that natural feeling.

That's why it's so important to remember that Medicare will not contact you about any services provided, nor will a doctor that you haven't seen. Just because you're told it may show up as a covered expense doesn't mean that It was necessary, or even legal.

Stay vigilant, and don't forget to keep track of your services received!

We're preparing for our next training of pharmacy students and community members on February 3-4th, and look forward to continuing the good work we do!














Try to rebuild the message.

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NEW YEAR'S HEALTH TIPS

- Pick a month for medical maintenance— Here's a tip for sticking to a schedule for routine
 medical care: Schedule your annual physical and other exams during your birthday month.
 That will make it easier to build an annual habit and remember the last time you had an exam,
 mammogram, eye appointment, hearing test or dental cleaning.
- 2. **Set a regular bedtime**—Start with the basics. Is your bedroom a haven for sleep? Is the room at the right temperature? Is it dark enough? Is it a peaceful haven or a cluttered mess? Are the mattress, pillows and bedding comfortable?
- 3. **Notice your sedentary behaviors (and get off the couch)** Start noticing when you've been sitting for a while, and get up and move. You don't have to go to the gym. Just do housework, take the dog for a walk or do 10 wall push-ups.
- 4. **Give time to your relationships**—Resolve this year to socialize. Plan a weekly lunch out of the office with a co-worker. Join a book club or other social group. Call a friend for a weekly walk around the park. Having fun with other people is an investment in your long-term health.
- 5. Add more variety to your diet—Make your diet more interesting. Scientists have found that the more diverse your diet, the more diverse your gut microbiome, which is the name for the trillions of microbes that inhabit your intestinal tract and play a crucial role in your health.
